Chris reported that the district received the letter of support of the Boothbay Harbor selectmen for the district's experimental kelp beds at their March 16 meeting. Chris forwarded the letter on to the Department of Marine Resources.

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Chris reported that he had yet to receive the long-awaited report from Brown & Caldwell. In a phone call with Mark Allenwood at B&C, the day of the trustees meeting, Allenwood assured Higgins that he could receive the company's report as early as the end of the week of March 14.

New Business:

Chris reported that modeling of the outfall to set up the bench model for kelp has begun is just about complete. Chris indicated that the calculations were difficult because of the dilution rates and the unknowns associated with them.

Chris reported the potential new owners of the mall were at the last planning board meeting and presented a letter from the district saying it could handle 190 gallons per day from the new 8,000 square feet of retail space to be constructed where the freestanding ATM is currently located in the parking lot. Chris said he advised that the district would require the project contractor to have submitted all necessary permits before the district would accept anything.

Chris reported that the district's camera, attached to the jetter, was damaged while district employees in Fish's parking lot on Commercial Street were doing work with it. Higgins said preliminary estimates are around the \$3,500 mark.
