First Quarter Budget Reports:

The superintendent handed out the first quarter budget reports. The reports were previously sent to the trustees via email. The superintendent advised the plant heat line and the sewer line maintenance line were over budget for the period. The plant heat line is done until December. The sewer maintenance line is over due to the point repair work done by Ted Berry Company. All other lines are normal for this time of year.

Old Business:

The Superintendent reported on the following:

- A. Relining Project: the superintendent reported pay request # 3 has been issued for review USDA and the District closed on the loan portion of the construction funds. The closing went well and was completed on April 10, 2015. The remainder of payments for the project will be done with grant funds from USDA.
- B. The superintendent reported the Ted Berry Company was onsite April 14, 2015 to finish the point repairs on Oak Street and Western Avenue. The repairs went well.
- C. Heating Plant Proposals: The superintendent reported Mechanical Services (MS) submitted shop drawings for the equipment. The superintendent authorized MS to proceed with the plant boiler as the equipment is what was specified. The remainder of the shops was sent to Wright-Pierce for review prior to authorization.

- A. Maine State Retirement System: The superintendent reported the crew inquired about the District joining the System. Currently, the District does not participate in any retirement program. The superintendent received documentation from the System. The documentation has to be completed and returned to MSRS for their review and then a cost estimate will be provided to the District for consideration.
- B. St. Andrews Village Addition: The superintendent handed out an email chain that was sent to Patrick Parson Miles Hospital and Sitelines PA. The emails surrounded the use of a proposed kitchen and the ability for the District to accept the newly generated wastewater. The superintendent advised the trustees the kitchen wastewater was the main concern. The District is requiring a trap for the facility. The District is awaiting a reply from St. Andrews regarding that use.
